

Polihali Operations Branch Introduces Improved Piggery Breeds to Support Livelihood Restoration



As part of the livelihood restoration programmes for communities affected by Phase II of the Lesotho Highlands Water Project, the Polihali Operations Branch has introduced improved piggery breeds to enhance household income and food security.

The breeds are kept at the Ramonakalali Demonstration Centre in Mokhotlong, Polihali. Four Comborough piggery breeds are currently housed at the centre to ensure that community members can access quality breeding stock at subsidised prices, helping them respond to their economic needs.

The Comborough piggery breeds are known for their resilience to the Mokhotlong environment and climate. They are also highly prolific, with an average litter size of up to 16 piglets per farrowing.

Through this initiative, the Lesotho Highlands Development Authority (LHDA) continues to implement its livelihood restoration policies by introducing sustainable projects aimed at improving the well-being of affected communities.
