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



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LEGAL INSTRUMENTS





The Treaty commits the two Governments to the implementation of Phase 1 and <u>subjects other phases</u> to negotiations

Provisions of the 1986 Treaty & its Protocols remain valid unless otherwise <u>amended by the Phase II</u> <u>Agreement</u>





- Article 18 Reviews at intervals of 12yrs Or as the Parties may agree.
 - 6 Protocols = Indication of On-going review process
 - Phase II Agreement = Another evidence
- Review process has started at Ministry Level and the Term of Reference will be presented to Cabinet Soon.





PROCUREMENT GUIDELINES



10 (a) Competitiveness, Transparency, Cost Effectiveness & Quality



10 (b) Preference Order – Lesotho, RSA, SADC then Other

10 (c) Firms from Lesotho and RSA shall share value of all infrastructure work equally on monetary basis, taking into account shareholding, operational experience, etc









BENEFITS FOR LESOTHO




BENEFITS TO LESOTHO



- **Royalty Revenue:** Approx. M840 Million in 2016
- Infrastructure: Roads, Bridges, Power lines and Telecom networks, Hospital, Clinics.
- **Skills Transfer to Basotho:** Both blue and white collar jobs
- **Job opportunities:** During Construction (22,000 person years of employment)
- Tourism potential as visitors come to see the water reservoirs, the nature reserves and other features associated with the Project.

















