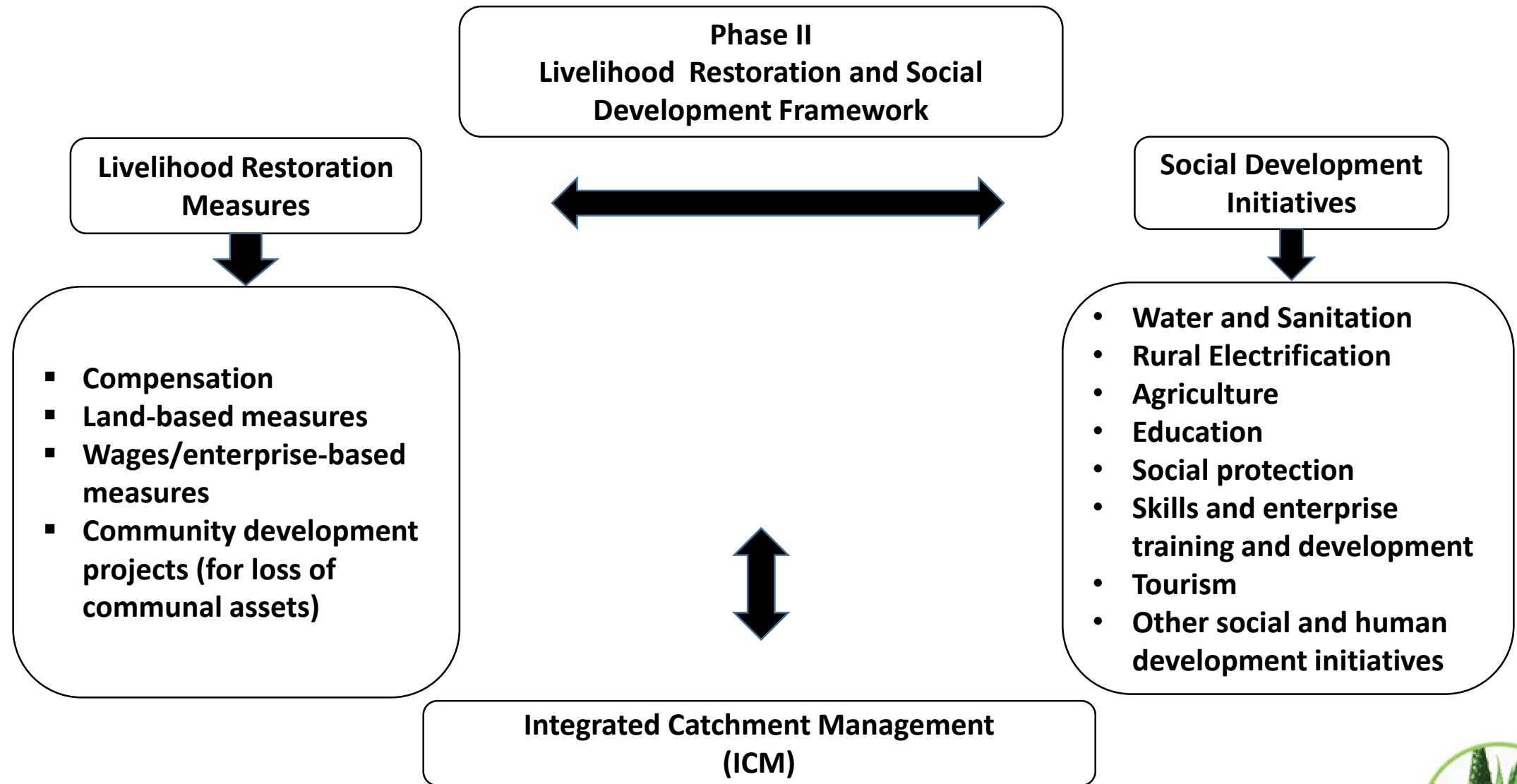

- Disadvantaged individuals

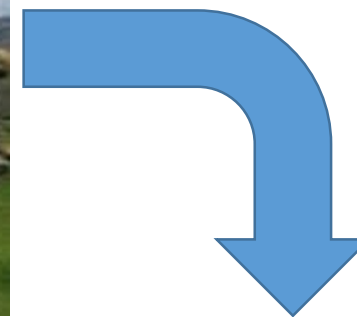
